Undergraduate students who enrolled at the University of Alabama in a regular program for the first time Summer, 1996, or after, are charged a Dining Dollars fee for each Fall and Spring semester for which they are enrolled for nine or more hours and for Summer terms for which they are enrolled for five or more hours. The fee is billed on the student account and is credited to the Action Card as Dining Dollars for student use.
